

2017 Severe Storms/Flooding National Dislocated Worker Grant (NDWG)

WorkForce West Virginia, a division of the Department of Commerce, has received from the U.S. Department of Labor a National Dislocated Worker Grant Fund for clean-up efforts as a result of the 2017 Severe Storms/Flooding that started on July 28-29, 2017, affecting (12) twelve counties in West Virginia: Doddridge, Harrison, Marion, Marshall, Monongalia, Ohio, Preston, Randolph, Taylor, Tucker, Tyler, and Wetzel counties.

What is the 2017 National Dislocated Worker Severe Storms/Flooding Grant?

Disaster funds for clean-up activities which includes:

- Providing temporary employment for clean-up activities in affected counties.
- Providing assistance delivering food, clothing, shelter or other humanitarian assistance and clean-up, demolition or reconstruction of public or non-profit buildings and also removal of debris from public lands, parks, roadways, streams or rivers.

Who is eligible for the program?

- Individuals who have lost their jobs due to the 2017 Severe Storms/Flooding.
- Other individuals who have been laid off from their jobs.
- Individuals who are unemployed for 27 weeks or more.
- Priority Given to Veterans.
