The WIOA Youth Program, part of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act, offers education, training, and employment services to eligible youth ages 14–24 who face barriers such as homelessness, foster care, parenting, justice involvement, or other challenges. The program aims to prepare young people for postsecondary education and employment by supporting career exploration, work readiness, life skills, and comprehensive support services. Its goals include helping youth earn credentials, gain job skills, and achieve long-term career success and economic self-sufficiency.

Performance Metrics	The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) performance metrics are a set of standardized indicators used to measure the effectiveness of WIOA-funded programs across the Adult, Dislocated Worker, and Youth programs. These metrics ensure accountability and help evaluate how well the workforce system supports job seekers and meets labor market needs.
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Employment Rate - 2nd and 4th quarter after exit: The percentage of program participants who are employed during the specified quarter after exiting the program. Youth program also includes those who are in education or training in the relevant quarter.

Median Earnings- 2nd quarter after exit: The median earnings of participants who are employed during the second quarter after program exit.

Credential Attainment Rate: The percentage of participants who attain a recognized postsecondary credential or obtain a high school diploma or equivalent, and are employed or in education within one year of program exit.

Measurable Skill Gains:
The percentage of participants who show progress toward a recognized credential. This metric is reported during participation, not after exit.
